- Get more customers through foot traffic from new residents

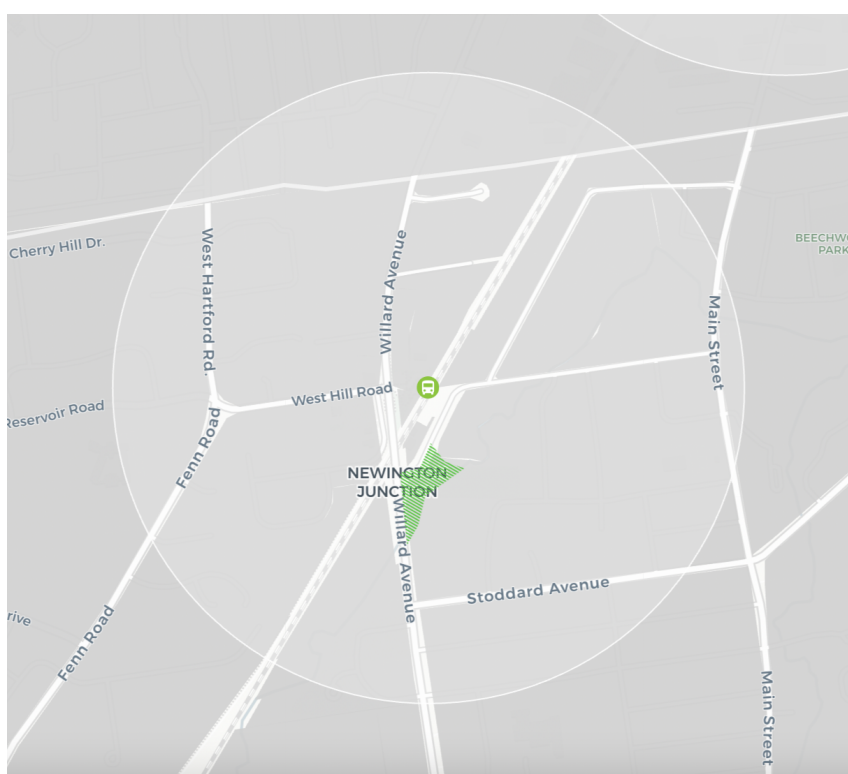
HOME-SEEKERS:

- Can live closer to work, shops, and restaurants
- Walk and exercise more, improving overall health

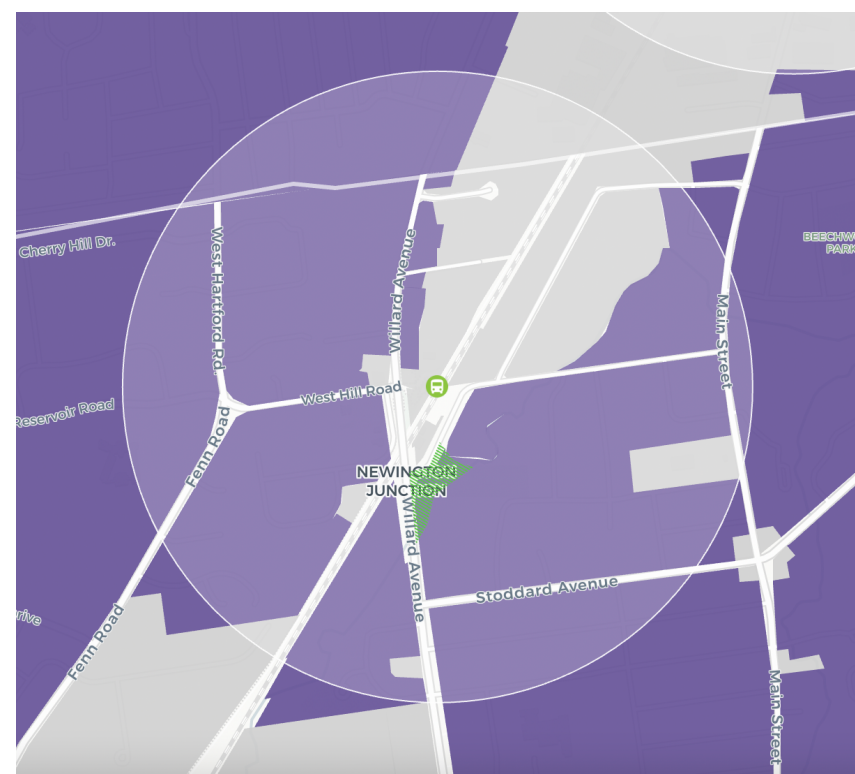
TOWNS AS A WHOLE:

- Expand the grand list and increase tax revenues

- Reduce per-unit infrastructure expenses because units are near existing infrastructure

Where Single-Family Housing is Allowed (in purple)

Newington's current zoning cheats everyone out of the benefits of housing near transit.

For example, the zoning code:

- Doesn't allow **any** 4+ family housing to be built around Newington Junction Station
- Permits way too much single-family housing

An onerous permitting process also deters new housing. In 2020, Massachusetts legalized housing around transit **statewide**. Shouldn't Newington and Connecticut catch up?
